Amy Tippey reported on Strategic Planning which started 12-01-10. They have some very thick and detailed reports. She is working on an abbreviated version to present at the next meeting.

She also reported on a Community Health Plan. It will be a county appointed committee of citizens focusing on how to build health into the future.

**ENVIRONMENTAL
HEALTH**

Evelyn Neavear reported January was Radon Awareness month. A press release was utilized. They normally sell between 10 and 15 radon test kits and this year was 46. They will be at the Home Show in Peoria on the 25th, 26th and 27th sharing a booth with Peoria County Health Department.

SOLID WASTE

Ray Corey reported on electric arc furnace dust that has been delisted as hazardous waste and it deposited into Indian Creek Landfill. There is a revision pending in the Supreme Court. The transportation of this has been temporarily terminated. This is a bi-product from manufacturing steel. The material is processed at the Pottstown Treatment Facility (PDC) This is of economic interest to the county as 90,000 tons has been deposited which represents ¼ million payment to the county.

Corey reported that the Appellate court found that the delisting process was not correctly evaluated.

Corey also reported on the 20 year Solid Waste Management plan. He said surveys have been developed for collecting raw data to develop the plan.

He reported that on 04-27-2011 there will be a Code Enforcement Conference. This has been successful in creating better communication with coding officials. This year an attorney has been retained to provide information regarding municipal prosecution for violations. He said a contract has been signed for a presentation in Tazewell County.

Corey provided a landfill update. Since the IDNR has updated the application process they have been struggling to complete as it is a huge task. The final piece is to provide IDNR with the information on the 20 year benefit to the county and how it will be monitored. That involves having the landowner sign an agreement with the county to grant access. Once the landowner is on board there will be a legal contract drawn up.

The committee discussed the next steps for the landfill project. Once a cap option has been decided upon and a financial plan created it will be time to take from Health Services to the Board.

Patrick Engineering can be involved with meeting of the Board to explain the plan and answer questions at one time.
